Welcome to week 4. We have had a great deal going on since our last newsletter. Within the classroom, it has been wonderful walking around and seeing what our writers have come up with whilst focusing on persuasive writing. This week's stimulus of "all students should ride or walk to school" has had a very strong theme and what I have picked up, is that the majority of our students' prefer to get driven or ride the bus to school. So to all our parents, although the students don't say it, from what I have read, they are grateful for the warm car and bus trips in the morning. It has been a busy last 2 weeks for our senior students. # Loarning Focus:

Reading: Currently, students are learning how to find the main idea of non-fiction texts. To find the main idea when you are reading, you can: Read the title and look at the cover for clues. Think about and identify the important information. look for repeated words, pictures, information, themes or ideas. Ask yourself, "What is the text mostly about?"

Writing: During writing time, students are learning about he text structure and language features of an information report. We are also focusing on the difference between fact and opinion.

Maths: For number and algebra, we have just finished a unit on addition and subtraction and will be beginning a unit on multiplication. For statistics and probability, students are learning about chance and the language we use to describe the likelihood of everyday events occurring.



# How to enrol



## What You'll Need:

- Centrelink Customer Reference Numbers (CRNs) for yourself and your child if you would like to claim Child Care Subsidy (CCS). Note that the person completing the enrolment must be the same person linked to the child for CCS
- Bank account details or card for direct debit
- One or more emergency contacts
- Doctor's contact information, management plan for any relevant medical conditions and your child's immunisation record

## Steps:

- Scan QR Code above or head to oshclub.com.au/register and click on Get Started to register as a new Kidsoft user
- 2 Validate your registered email address (you will receive an email)
- Create your account password
- A Select your service in 'Find a Place'
- Complete the 'Waitlist' form by adding your child's details (separate one for each child)
- Complete the enrolment form and your local service team will be in touch

- Please allow 10-15 minutes to enrol, so it's a great time to grab a cuppa!
- · Your email address will be your username and the main point of contact.
- Download the Kidsoft app on your mobile to manage your bookings!
