Just a reminder that this Friday 12th September is the deadline to return forms for the free dental treatment.


JSC PIES & SAUGAGE ROLL ORDERS

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Principal's Report - Term 3, Week 8

Welcome to Week 8 and our final newsletter for Term 3. Although this has been a shorter term, it has certainly been jam-packed with learning, rewarding student effort, and a wide range of engaging extracurricular activities.

Last week, our students travelled to Ballarat where they enjoyed a session at the new Flipout venue and attended the performance of The Gruffalo's Child. Staff reported that our students represented the school exceptionally well. There were many moments where our student leaders supported younger students, and also times when our students assisted members of the public at Flipout. All of our staff are incredibly proud of how our students conducted themselves. It is wonderful to see that not only do they shine here at school, but also show themselves to be outstanding citizens in the wider community.

I was fortunate to attend a two-day conference in Melbourne for the Victorian Principals Association. This event was designed to broaden our perspectives by exploring leadership beyond education, and featured inspiring keynote speakers. Two highlights for me were a former performance and conditioning coach with the All Blacks, who worked with them for over 300 games, and a Red Bull race pilot who was part of the original Australian Top Gun program. Listening to their stories was both motivating and thought-provoking, and I came away with valuable insights into leadership—both the strengths and the challenges—that I can continue to apply here at our school.

This Thursday, three of our students—Grace, Hunter, and Ruby—will proudly represent the school at the Divisional Athletics in Llanberrs. We wish them every success and hope they enjoy the experience as much as the competition.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Today, our whole staff team is working with Glenn Pearsall, focusing on Tier 1 and Tier 2 classroom behaviour interventions. This professional learning will help us strengthen our classroom practices to continue supporting student learning and engagement.

Over the holiday break, work will begin on our building upgrade project. New carpet will be laid in the library, office, staff room, and entryway, and window replacements will also take place. Because the builders need full access to the inside of the building, there will be no school holiday program this term.

Weatherboard replacement is also scheduled during this time. When students return for Term 4, the grounds will still be very much a construction zone; however, all classroom learning areas will remain unaffected. (See image below)


























WEEKLY OVERVIEW




