We will hold our final assembly on Friday 16th December at 9:00am. Members of the school community are welcome to attend as we farewell our grade 6 students and outgoing staff members.





- Centrelink Customer Reference Numbers (CRNs) for yourself and your child if you would like to claim Child Care Subsidy (CCS). Note that the person completing the enrolment must be the same person linked to the child for CCS
- Bank account details or card for direct debit
- One or more emergency contacts
- Doctor's contact information, management plan for any relevant medical conditions and your child's immunisation record

Steps:

- Scan QR Code above or head to oshclub.com.au/register and click on Get Started to register as a new Kidsoft user
- 2 Validate your registered email address (you will receive an email)
- Create your account password
- Select your service in 'Find a Place'
- Complete the 'Waitlist' form by adding your child's details (separate one for each child)
- Complete the enrolment form and your local service team will be in touch
